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




THEProject 2020 is the 9th annual collegiate project management competition offered by the Western Michigan Project Management Institute (WMPMI). Although project management tends to favor business, computer science, and engineering curriculums, students in all academic disciplines are highly encouraged to participate.

Student teams from colleges and universities throughout the WMPMI service area help create solutions for a real-life scenario in the form of a project plan.

Each team is provided a detailed scenario and assigned a PMP® (project management professional) certified mentor to teach them how to transform their solutions into project plans using the initiating and planning processes documented in A Guide to the Project Management Body of Knowledge (a.k.a., the PMBOK).

Teams will present their plans to a panel of judges on Event Day. The winning team will be chosen based on demonstration of proper project management techniques, the quality of their solutions, and their ability to present their project plans.

A variety of prizes are available to participants and winners of THEProject.

SCENARIO



Select Program Curriculum, Hire Faculty and Staff, & Launch PM Program by August 30, 2021

President Smith, your university president, announced during the fall 2019 opening address that she has established a new School of Project Management (PM) that will confer bachelor and master's degrees in project management. A project to renovate a LEED certified building to house the new school was recently completed and the activation phase of the program is ready to begin.

The Project Management curriculum must offer three areas of study emphasis: Information Technology Project Management, Construction Project Management, and General Project Management.

The dean of arts and sciences and the newly hired director for the school of project management are basing the school's curriculum on the Project Management Institute's Academic Group's three-volume set of curriculum guidelines, which were developed by project management university faculty from around the world. Coursework for both under-graduate and postgraduate programs must be included.



The Goals of the Project Plan

- Phases for selection of the program curriculum, hiring academic faculty & administrative staff, onboarding academic faculty & administrative staff, course catalog and schedule creation, and budget
- Detailed tasks to track the work of establishing a new School of Project Management
- Meeting and reporting cadence to manage Stakeholders expectation
- Budget detail for each activation phase of the project with transparent burn down data for Stakeholders

Both stakeholders encourage your team to seek their advice and to seek the advice of the Selection Committee who will be executing the hiring plan. The Selection Committee is chaired by the Director for the School of Project Management.



Wireless monitoring offers children the ability to move freely about their room, floor and playroom during their testing, which takes place over a long period of time and can last from 24 hours to several days. Patients are also able to be monitored within the redesigned Floor 6 playroom (formerly the Blue Glass Studio), giving children and caretakers a place to interact and play normally while advanced neurodiagnostic testing is occurring.

· Spectrum Health Corporate: United Clinical Communication (UCC) — Bob VanWyngarden, Project Manager; Jenn Putnam, Program Manager

Spectrum Health currently uses Ascom phones for clinical communication. With vendor support ending in late 2020, Spectrum has taken the opportunity to completely replace this system with Voalte (Hill-Rom) smartphone technology to provide a secure platform for critical alerting and messaging. As of March, the implementation team completed work at all regional hospitals, ambulatory facilities and Blodgett, training staff and deployed 2131 devices in 220 departments. Nearly 2000 additional devices will be deployed at the Grand Rapids Medical Campus in the coming months.

· Spectrum Health Corporate: Warehouse Management System Project – Cathy Kehoe, Project Manager

Spectrum Health's distribution center has been transformed digitally with a warehouse management system to more efficiently manage the thousands of products and millions of dollars of inventory for the Spectrum Health system, streamlining the process from order to delivery. With the new WMS, handheld scanners and a digital database will allow the supply chain team to more accurately and quickly provide the medical supplies and other products needed for our staff and patients.

It's exciting to be a part of a profession that crosses all industries and engages with all levels within a company from front line team members to senior leadership. At the end of the day, what's most exciting is to see the impact we are making in being the best provider of health care services and health insurance as possible for our communities.




