

Social Impact vs. Social Good

Defining your impact

Social Impact at PMI specifically means leveraging project management to empower individuals and transform communities. This may include:

- Skill-based volunteering applying professional PM expertise
- Sustainable capacity building within nonprofits
- Youth education in project management
- Creating systemic, long-term improvement

Social Good refers to general actions that benefit society, like beach clean-ups or food drives.

- Traditional, hands-on volunteering
- Short-term direct service
- Addressing immediate needs

While traditional volunteer activities contribute to social good, the PMI focus for social impact is specifically on leveraging the unique professional skills of its members through social impact volunteering to create deeper, systemic improvements within non-profit organizations.


Project Management is the Light that Illuminates Purposeful Action

Clarity and Structure

 Project management brings clarity and structure to converting mission passion into actionable and organized plans

Prioritization and Alignment

 It helps organizations prioritize tasks and align resources effectively to maximize overall impact

- Proof of concept of a new approach to provide clean water
- Key project management concepts used and shared: risk management, stakeholder involvement, communication plan, etc.
- All materials available on the island, plans are simple and in Spanish

Measuring and Continuing Impact

Measure Impact of:

- Organization
- Organization's project
- Your project management assistance
- Combination

Examples:

- Progress against mission
- Project alignment with mission
- Project continuing impact
- Critical relevant metrics





Highlighting Hidden Needs, Risks and Resource Constraints

Maturity Assessment

 Determine area(s) of greatest need from a project management perspective, then address those together

Early Risk Identification

 Structured processes enable early detection of potential risks, preventing surprises and delays in projects

Resource Prioritization

 Aligning limited resources to critical priorities ensures efficient use and better project outcomes






Revealing True Stakeholder Needs Through Structured Engagement

Systematic Stakeholder Engagement

 Structured engagement helps gather accurate insights from stakeholders, addressing genuine community needs

Alignment with Mission Goals

 Engagement ensures projects stay aligned with organizational mission and stakeholder expectations





RACI Matrices to Define Responsibility and Accountability

Clarifying Responsibilities

 RACI matrices specify who is responsible for executing each task to ensure clear accountability

Ensuring Accountability

 The matrix identifies who is accountable for decisions and outcomes, preventing overlaps and gaps

Facilitating Communication

 RACI defines who should be consulted and informed, improving stakeholder communication and feedback

Establishing Timelines and Accountability

Setting Deadlines

 Establishing clear deadlines helps maintain discipline and drives progress toward project completion

Assigning Responsibilities

 Assigning specific roles ensures accountability and clarifies ownership of tasks within the team

Ensuring Timely Delivery

 Timely delivery of results is achieved through effective timeline management and team accountability






Making Invisible Impact Visible

 Clear demonstration of results enhances trust and encourages ongoing support from communities and donors






How to Get Involved
